

BIOGRAPHICAL NOTES ON CONTRIBUTORS

E. Thadeus Flood

Ph.D. Washington, Seattle: currently Assistant Professor of History, University of Santa Clara, California. Dr. Flood was a Fulbright Fellow at the University of Tokyo from 1963-65 and Chulalongkorn University, Bangkok, in 1966. He has helped translate *The Dynastic Chronicles of the Fourth Reign of the Bangkok Era* and is currently completing a study of Thai-Japanese foreign relations in the 1930's and 1940's.

K.E. Koch

Born Giessen, Germany 1933; studied geology at Marburg and Grenoble and graduated Ph.D. in Alpine Geology in 1959, since when he has worked for the Geological Survey of the Federal Republic of Germany. After different assignments in European and African countries he took up his post with the German Geological Mission in Northern and Western Thailand in 1965, where he is engaged in geological mapping in collaboration with the Department of Mineral Resources.

M. Siebenhuner

Born Leipzig, Germany, 1939, and took his doctorate in 1967. He now working for the Geological Survey of the Federal Republic of Germany which sent him to Thailand in 1967 to work with the German Geological Mission in Northern Thailand (mostly in Nan).

Hans J. Spielman

Institute of Sociology and Anthropology, University of Heidelberg: is working on material obtained during a year's fieldwork among the Lisu, Lahu Na and Lahu Shenleh of Northern Thailand; previously made a study of the Bawm-Zo, a hill tribe in East Pakistan, the results of which were presented as a dissertation and published at Heidelberg in 1968.

M.B. Chulalongkorn University, 1937 : Ph. D. Duke University 1954; former Chief of Food and Beverage Analysis, Department of Medical Sciences, Ministry of Public Health, and Head of the Department of Microbiology, Faculty of Medicine, Chiangmai. Currently Research Officer, Technological Research Institute, Applied Scientific Research Corporation of Thailand.

Helen L. Smith

Ph.D. Economic Geography, Clark University, 1958. Miss Smith was Associate Geographer for South East Asia, Board of Geographical Names from 1942-6, working for the U.S. Department of the Interior, and Associate Professor of Geography at Wheaton College, Illinois, for 16 years. From 1963-4 she was visiting lecturer at the University of Illinois and for the past five years has been lecturer in Geography at Chulalongkorn University, Bangkok.

Hans Penth

Ph.D. Frankfurt-am-Main: currently lecturer in South East Asian studies at the University of Chiangmai. Dr. Penth's special field is the study of the Thai peoples.

John Blofeld

John Blofeld, formerly a lecturer at Chulalongkorn University Bangkok and now Chief Editor, U.N.E.C.A.F.E., is well known for translations of original works concerning Buddhism. He has recently completed "The Way of Power", to be published shortly by Allen and Unwin which a study of Tibetan Buddhist meditational techniques. He is now at work on "The Buddhist World", which will consist mostly of photographs.

Tej Bunnag

Studied at King's College, Cambridge and St. Anthony's College, Oxford; D. Phil. Oxon 1969; now working in the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Bangkok.
